

Purpose of Torah

God chose Israel as the seed of Abraham to be the priestly nation that would restore mankind to its proper role as rulers for God over His created earth.

- ✓ Hebrew = Bereshith (בְּרֵאשִׁית; "In the beginning")
- ✓ Greek = Genesis (ΓΕΝΕΣΙΣ; "Origin, Source, Generation, Beginning")

WHO—Authorship

✓ Moses (John 5:45 –47; Exod 17:14)

WHO—Audience

✓ Second Generation Israel

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Introduction to Genesis

WHEN

- ✓ Approximately 1406 BC
- ✓ 40 years after the exodus from Egypt
- ✓ 1446 BC = Exodus from Egypt (key date!)

Introduction to Genesis

WHERE

- ✓ First part of a five-part series
- ✓ Wilderness of Sinai / Plains of Moab
- \checkmark Israel poised to take the Promised Land
- ✓ Dates of Genesis events span from Creation to the Death of Joseph

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Introduction to Genesis

WHY

- $\checkmark~$ This book is the WHO of God's Kingdom Plan for Israel
- ✓ The Seed is the "WHO"
- ✓ Corporate Solidarity

To instruct Israel (and the world) on the history of creation and the origins of their nation and how the one and only God, Yahweh, is raising up Israel and their Seed to destroy sin and the curse and restore the world to the paradise of the Garden of Eden.

Introduction to Genesis

- ✓ Blessing (1:22, 28; 2:3; 5:2; 9:1, 26; 12:2, 3; 14:19, etc.)
- ✓ Land (Earth; 1:1, 2, 10, 11, 12, 15, 17; 6:5, 6, 11, 12, 13, 17; 12:1, etc.)
 ✓ Kingly or Regal terms (1:16, 28; 3:16; 4:7; 14:18; 17:6, 16; 35:11; 49:20, etc.)
