Overview of Future Events

(Pretribulational Premillennial View)

- 1. Rapture and Resurrection of the Saints (1 Thess 4:13-18)
- 2. The Judgment (Bema) Seat of Christ (1Cor3:11- 4:5; 2 Cor 5:10) takes place in Heaven
- 3. The Marriage of the Lamb (Rev 19:9) starts or occurs in Heaven
- 4. The Tribulation: Seven-year period of judgment on earth (Dan 9:24-27; Rev 6-19)
 - Purpose1: Bring national Israel and some Gentiles under New Covenant
 - Purpose2: Judge wicked people and nations


- 5. Second Coming of Christ to Earth
 - Tribulation ends
 - Five Important Events in connection with Second Coming:
 - Judgment of living Gentiles (Matt 25:31ff)
 - Judgment of living Israel (Matt 25:1-11)
 - Resurrection and reward of OT saints and Tribulation martyrs
 - (Rev 20:4-6; Dan 12:2, 13; Rev 6:9)
 - Binding of Satan (Rev 20:1-3)
 - Establishment of Messianic Kingdom

Overview of Future Events

- 6. Millennial Kingdom of Jesus Christ
 - Fulfillment of unconditional Covenants (Abrahamic, Davidic, New [Priestly is likely as well])
 - Righteousness, peace, ecological renewal, long life, etc.
- 7. The Final Judgments (Rev 20:7-15;1 Cor 6:3)
 - Final judgment of Satan and fallen angels
 - Great White Throne Judgment of all unbelievers
 - Judgment of heavens and earth (2 Peter 3:7-10)
- 8. The Eternal State (Rev 21:22)

1. "Rapture" from Latin translation of Greek word "caught up" in 1 Thess 4:17 2. Primary texts: 1 Thess 4:13-18; 1 Cor 15:51-57; John 14:3 3. Examples of Rapture in Scripture: Elijah, Jesus, 2 Witnesses 4. Components of the Rapture (all described in above texts) - The (partial) return of Christ - Resurrection of dead church saints - Translation of living believers - Glorious reunion - Glorified bodies - Speed of Rapture

5. Timing of Rapture related to Tribulation - Amillennial and Postmillennial—coming of Christ is single event followed by general resurrection and judgment - Five Views of Premillennialism - Pretrib—rapture before seven years - Mid-trib—midpoint of seven years - Pre-wrath—3/4 of the way through seven years - Post-Trib—Rapture and Second Coming are single event at end of Tribulation ("BOING") - Partial Rapture—only "spiritual" Christians will be raptured (Robert Govett,

8. Biblical Defense of Pre-Trib Rapture

- Church is promised deliverance from divine wrath (1 Thess 1:10; 5:9; Rev 3:10)
- Differences between Rapture Passages and Second Coming Passages
- Pre-Trib best explains presence of non-glorified saints in Millennial Kingdom (Isaiah 65:20; Rev 20:7-10)— allows for salvation of those born in
- Nature and purpose of Tribulation excludes the church (prepare Israel for Christ and judge unbelieving world)
 Expectation of Church is imminent coming of Christ, not Tribulation period
- (1 Cor 1:7; Titus 2:13; Phil 3:20)
- The Thessalonian's disturbance indicates Pre-Trib (2 Thess 2:2-3)

Overview of Tribulation

- <u>Great Tribulation generally speaks of second half</u>
- Seal Judgments begin Tribulation (Rev 6:2)
- "Day of the Lord"—Jer 30:7-9; 2 Peter 3:10; Isaiah 4:2; 19:23-25; 34:8ff; 35:1-6
 - General term for any intervention by God (Zeph, Joel)
 - PAST: Judgment of Israel
 - FUTURE: Judge nations and discipline Israel,
 - Millennial Kingdom, remake heavens and earth
 - Future Day of the Lord BROADLY = Seven years; - NARROWLY = Return of Christ
- "Wrath of God" (1 Thess 1:10; Rev 11:18; Rev 6:16-17)
- Seventieth Week of Daniel 9:24-27 (Rev 12:14; 11:2; 13:5; 12:6)

 Antichrist, Man of Lawlessness, beast, little horn (1 John 2:18; 2 Thess 2:3-4; Rev 13/17; Dan 7:8) 	
 Career Leader of western nation (Dan 7:8) Prince who is to come (Dan 9:26) 	
Signs covenant with Israel (Dan 9:27)Begins to conquer other nations (Dan 7:8)	
 Apparently assassinated and "raised" (Rev 13) Breaks covenant with Israel (Dan 9:27) Rules as dictator for last 3 1/2 years (Rev 13:5ff) 	
Persecutes Jews (Rev 12) Destroys apostate church in favor of Antichrist worship (Rev 17)	
Defeated by Christ at end of the Tribulation (Rev 19:20)

Salvation in Tribulation

- Many Jews
 144,000

- 144,000
 Jews who flee into wilderness (Rev 12)
 Remnant in the land (Rev 12)
 Final salvation of Jews (Zech 12:10)
 1/3 of Israel saved (Zech 13:8-9)
 Rebellious Jews judged and killed (Ezek 20:33-44; Zech 13:8-9; Matt 25:1-13)
 All Jews who enter Millennial Kingdom are saved—THUS FULFILLING Rom 11:26

 Many Gentiles
 Souls of fifth seal (Rev 6:9)
 Unnumbered Martyrs (Rev 7:9-10)
 Rebellious Gentiles judged and killed (Matt 25:31-46)
 NOTE: 2 Thess 2:10-12 seems to indicate that rejection of the gospel PRIOR to rapture does not give a second chance AFTER
