Several of the prophets had glimpses of heaven. Paul in 2 Cor. 12:2, speaks of a man (likely Paul himself) who saw heaven. Certainly, Jesus had been there and spoken of it to us. John had a revelation of Jesus and some things of heaven. What will the experience of heaven be like?

- 1. Physical Delights: 1) A real physical body: 2 Cor. 5:1, "tent" is used speaking of our body being temporary. But Paul speaks in V1 that if our body or tent is torn down, we have a building from God, a place with a roof, or a house, a permanent dwelling, that is eternal in the heavens. V2-3, we long to be clothed (not naked), and V3 says that we will put on this permanent body and not be found naked. V6-8 speaks of death and the believer being absent from the body and present with the Lord in the context of having a permanent body fit for heaven.
 - **a.** <u>Rev. 6:9-11</u> speaks of those who were slain during the Tribulation but in V11, they received a white robe until the rest of their brothers are killed. A robe needs a body.
 - 2) <u>Food and drink</u>: Is. 35:1-10 and Amos 9:13 speak of feasts and wine and Isaiah speaks of things that are familiar to us. Rev. 19 speaks of the marriage supper of the Lamb. Matt. 26:29, Jesus will partake of communion with us. Luke 12:37, Jesus speaks of the master waiting on those who are awake when he comes. 3) <u>Adornment</u>: Clothes are seen as given because of sin (Gen. 2:25, 3:7, 21), but clothing is found throughout Scripture in reference to the saints. 1 Tim. 2:9, speaks of women being adorned with proper clothing. Rev. 6:9-11, speaks of tribulation saints having robes. Rev. 19:7-8 speaks of the saints being clothed in the fine linen of righteous acts. In Matt. 17:2, Jesus' garments became white as light and there is no mention of Moses and Elijah needing to be clothed by Peter. Is. 64:6 contrasts righteous acts done apart from faith in God as filthy rags. Multitudes of every nation are adorned in white robes, Rev. 7:9-14, prepared to worship God in verse 15-17. 4) <u>Color</u>: Rev. 4:3 speaks of the color of emeralds and a rainbow around the throne of God.
- 2. <u>Spiritual Satisfaction or the Joys of Heaven</u>: 1) <u>Prayers of the saints</u>: Rev. 5:8, are all to be kept and answered. 2) <u>Reward</u>: a) Crowns being cast at the feet of Jesus, Rev. 4:10. Matt. 5:12, rewards for suffering persecution. The reward of those who have given up things in life, Matt. 19:28-30. The reward of serving Christ, Luke 19:11-21. 3) <u>Music</u>: Rev. 5:8-9, harps are played. Ps. 150, all kinds of instruments are commanded to be used in the worship of God.
 - **a.** What is the function of music in heaven: Rev. 5:9-10, a) extolling the glory of Christ. b) exclaiming the work of Christ. c) explaining the Gospel. d) expecting the reign of Christ. The posture of this worship: V8, the elders "fell down before the Lamb."
 - 4) <u>Dancing</u>: Ps. 150:4 dancing is the word meaning dancing in a circle. It is used 28X in Scripture and is used a) in general celebration; b) in sexual sin; c) associated with the perfected, consummated work of God. Ps. 30:11, our mourning turned into dancing. Ps. 149:1-3, speaks of dancing for those in glory (V5-6). Luke 15:11-32, dancing and celebration was enjoyed for the return of the prodigal son.
- **3.** The Real Temple of God: Believers worship many different places today, but in generations past, there was a place to gather for Israel; the tabernacle (Heb. 8:1-5), Solomon's temple, and altars. 1) The Temple of God is in Heaven. Heb. 8:5, the temple and tabernacle are copies of the throne room of God. 2) Real Ark of His Covenant: Rev. 11:19 speaks of it, it is there because it is an eternal covenant. 3) Altar of God: Rev. 6:9. 4) Tree of Life: Rev. 2:7. 5) Interceding Son of God: Heb. 9:24, 1 John 2:1-2, Jesus our Advocate intercedes for us.

How are a renewed creation, a new heaven and earth, and an eternal kingdom easier to understand with the light of God's original picture in the Garden of Eden?
