

WHY

- ✓ This book is the WHEN of God's Kingdom Plan for Israel.
- Numbers informs us that the people of Israel will only take the Promised Land after wandering for forty years. This theme of delay and wandering/testing in the desert becomes a hallmark in Scripture.

 Exiles of Israel and Judah into the east

 David and his wandering

 - Jesus and His wandering

To recount to Israel the sin of the first generation of Israel who came out of Egypt, leading to forty years of wilderness wanderings and a delay to conquer the Land of Canaan.

HOW—Terminology and Themes

- ✓ The Wilderness (1:1, 19; 3:4, 14; 9:1, 5; 10:13 (2x), 31; 12:16; 13:3, 21, etc.)
 ✓ The Rebellion of Israel (e.g., spies in chapters 13 14; Korah's rebellion in chapter 16; the sin at Baal-Peor in chapter 25)
 ✓ The Wrath of God toward disobedient people (chapter 11, 12, 14, 15, 16, 20, 21, 25)

- The Wrath of God toward disobedient people (enapter 11, 12 20, 21, 25)
 Blessing of God through Balaam (chapters 23 24)
 The Numbers (e.g., genealogies; evidence of Yahweh's grace)
 The Patience of Yahweh
- ✓ Holiness (3:13, 28, 31, 32, 38, 47, 50; 4:4 (2x), 12, 15 (3x), 16, 19 (2x), 20; 5:16; 6:5, 8, 11, 20, etc.)

HOW—Literary Structure

- ✓ First Generation of Israel—Israel Sins and Perishes (1:1 26:18)
- ✓ Second Generation of Israel—Israel Regroups and Conquers (26:19 -36:13)

The Outline of the book is framed by the genealogies of the first generation (1:2) and the second generation (26:2). This corresponds with the theme of WHEN in the book.
