

Definitions

- ✓ Worship is all that we are reacting rightly to all that God is (John MacArthur)
- ✓ Worship is a response to the revelation of the Holy LORD God of glory (Allen Ross)

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Introduction to Worship

A Response to Revelation

- ✓ Revealed Holiness of God (Isa 6:1–4; Rev 4:8)
- ✓ Revealed Glory of God (Isa 6:3; Ps 19:1; Ex 33:18)

Worship Before Mount Sinai ✓ Adam and Eve ❖ Immediate access to God ❖ Would become mediated access ❖ Sacrifice—cover bodies and substitute for immediate death ✓ Abel ❖ Sacrifice accompanied by faith (Heb 11:4) ❖ Went out of his way to please God, as opposed to Cain's perfunctory duty

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✓ Noah

Worship Before Mount Sinai ✓ Abraham ♦ Abram's altar (Gen 12:7)—response to revelation and expression of gratitude ♦ Almost-sacrifice of Isaac (Gen 22)—demonstration of complete submission and faith ✓ Moses ♦ Revelation of God caused worship (Ex 3:5) ♦ Israel responded to God's power (Ex 4:31) ✓ Passover ♦ Rejoicing at deliverance from bondage ♦ Central feature was the Passover lamb

❖ Pre-figured Christ (1 Cor 5:7)

 $\ensuremath{ \diamondsuit}$ Offered sacrifice after Flood as expression of gratitude and submission

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Worship After Mount Sinai ✓ Tabernacle/Temple ❖ Purpose—clear reality of the presence of God (Ex 25:8) ❖ Accessed governed by outer court, Holy Place and Most Holy Place ❖ Jesus the ultimate fulfillment of the tabernacle and temple (John 1:14; 2:19)

Worship Requires Sacrifice

- $\checkmark\,\,$ "Sacrifice is at the center of worship as the basis and expression of it" (Ross,
 - ❖ Worship is halted by sin
 - ❖ For people to commune with God, atonement for sin must be achieved
 - ❖ OT Sacrificial system
 - > Purity was the concern of God
 - ➤ Worshipper needed acceptance by God
 - > God grants the effectiveness of the sacrifice
 - Offering is costly
 - ➤ Covenant Fellowship

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Worship Requires Sacrifice

- ✓ OT Sacrifices and NT Fulfillment
 - Purification offering (Lev 4:1ff, 6:24–30) 2 Cor 5:21
 - Reparation Offering (Lev 5:15 6:7; 7:1–6)
 - Matt 5:23-24
 - ❖ Burnt offering
 - The enjoyment of continued fellowship with God through Christ
 - ❖ Dedication offering Heb 10:5-7

 - Peace offering
 The Lord's Table

Worship Requires Sacrifice

- ✓ Giving of Physical Possessions as Worship
 - ❖ OT (Levi 27:30–31; Num 18:8–13; 19–32; Deut 14:22–23; 26:12– 15; Neh 10:35-39)
 - ➤ Tithe #1 = 10%
 - ➤ Tithe #2 = 10%
 - > 3rd and 6th year Tithe for the poor
 - > Animal sacrifices three times per year
 - > Vows and freewill offerings

Worship Requires Sacrifice

- ✓ Giving of Physical Possessions as Worship
 - NT
 - > Principle of giving as worship is the same
 - ➤ We have been purchased therefore all we have belongs to God
 - > Giving is an acknowledgment of our debt to Christ

Worship Requires Sacrifice

- \checkmark Christ is the ultimate sacrifice—the culmination of OT worship and is the basis for NT worship
 - ❖ Lamb of God (John 1:29, 36)
 - * Ransom for many (Mark 10:45)
 - ❖ The Last Supper, giving us the Lord's Supper
 - ❖ Book of Hebrews makes the clear connection to Christ
 - ❖ Christ is the One Mediator—none other

True Worship COSTS

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Function of Worship

- ✓ Worship Involves:
 - Fear and adoration
 - Confession and commitment
 - ❖ Sacrificial Acts of devotion and service
 - $\ref{thm:problem} \begin{tabular}{ll} \begin$
 - ❖ Praise—exaltation and adoration of God
 - ❖ Prayer—communication with God, thanksgiving, supplication
 - ❖ Covenant affirmation—responding to God's Word with obedience
