Angelology

Beginning of Human Life/Personhood

Differing Views:

- During gestation process following conception
- Begins at birth
- Post-birth with minimal functioning
- Begins at conception

Begins at Conception:

- God's creation of a person is not a process but an event
- Traditional view of most Christians
- Didache (early book of Christian teaching): "Thou shalt not murder a child by abortion not kill that which was begotten"
- Letter of Barnabas
- Clement of Alexandria, Tertullian, Chrysostom, Jerome, Martin Luther, John Calvin

Biblical Conclusions:

- The Bible regards the unborn as human persons in a full sense
- Gen 25:22-23—Jacob and Esau
- •Exodus 21:22-25
- •Isaiah 44:24
- •Job 10:8-11
- •Psalm 139:13-16
- •Isaiah 49:1
- Jeremiah 1:5

Is Abortion Murder?

Four Criteria that determine murder:

- Person must be killed
- Must be killed intentionally
- The victim is innocent (not official government judgment)
- Unlawful or sinful motive must be behind the killing

End of Life Views

- Continuation of soul but no continuation of body—no resurrection
- Cessationism—life ceases completely
- Annihilationism—life ceases completely for the unsaved
- Soul Sleep—no intermediate state between death and resurrection
- Reincarnation—we come back as cockroach, eagle, geranium, Buick, etc

Biblical Perspectives on Death

- End of a person's temporal existence
- Must involve discussion of anthropology and hamartiology
- Death is inevitable (except for the Lord's return)
- Death is both natural and unnatural
- Death is an enemy and curse (Heb 2:15;
 1 Cor 15:26)

Biblical Perspectives on Death

- Death is feared, final, and often unexpected
- Death is under God's sovereign control—1
 Sam 2:6; Job 12:10; Ps 90:3
- Death occurs when a person takes his final breath (Job 14:10)
- Three types of death: spiritual, physical, eternal

Biblical Perspectives on Death

- What Comes After Death?
 - Intermediate state in recognizable spirit form
 - Psalm 49:15; Ps 73:24; Eccl 12:7; Luke 9:30-31; Luke 16:19-31; Luke 23:43; Acts 7:59-60; 2 Cor 5:8; Phil 1:22-24
 - Resurrection of the body
 - Job 19:26; Isaiah 26:19; Daniel 12:2; John 5:28-29; 1 Cor. 15:42-43; 1 Cor. 15:51-52; 1 Thess. 4:16-17
 - Endless life in either heaven or hell (Rev 20-22)

Angelology Broad Overview

Definition: A created spirit being with moral and intellectual ability but no physical body TERMS:

- "host" (of heaven) (Neh 9:6; 1 Kgs 22:19)
- Sons of God" and "morning stars" (Job 1:6; 38:7)
- "Watchers" (Dan 4:13, 17, 23)
- "Ministering spirits" (Heb 1:14)

Angelology Broad Overview

NOT called angels specifically but the best option:

- 1. "Cherubim" (Eden and Ark of Covenant)
- 2. "Seraphim" (Isaiah 6)
- 3. "Living creatures"—Ezek 1 and Rev 4

Basic Facts:

- Likely created first day of creation to be witnesses to creation (Job 38:6-7)
- Non-reproducing (Matt 22:28-30)
- Immortal (Luke 20:36)
- Personal beings
- Spirit beings (Heb 1:14) yet can manifest physically (Gen 18:3)
- Powerful (Ps 103:20)
- Arranged in hierarchy—Col 1:16; Jude 6 & 9,
- Holy angels (1 Tim 5:21) vs. fallen angels (2 Pet 2:4; Jude 6; Rev 9:11)

Tasks

- Rejoicing at creation (Job 38:7)
- Guarding Eden (cherubs Gen 3:24)
- Visiting patriarchs (Gen 18-19)
- Protecting Israel (Dan 10:13; cf. chaps 8-12)
- Giving the Law (?) (Gal 3:19; Acts 7:53)

Tasks

- Delivering messages (Dan 4, 9; Rev 1:1; Acts 12; 27:23-24)
- Delivering revelation concerning Christ:
 - birth (Luke 1:26)
 - resurrection (Matt 28:5-7)
 - ascension (Acts 1:10)
- Strengthening Christ in wilderness (Matt 4:11) and in Gethsemane (Luke22:43)
- Army of Christ at his 2nd Coming (Matt 25:31)

Tasks

With Believers:

- Sent to serve (Heb 1:14)
- Protection (Ps 91:11)
- Conducting departed spirit (?) (Luke 16:22)
- Observing Christian experiences (1 Cor 4:9; cf. 1 Pet 1:12)
- Gathering the elect at the end (Matt 24:31)

Satan and Demons: Key Facts

- Satan's name is not Lucifer
- Christian cannot be "possessed"—2 Cor 5:17; Col 1:13
- Don't major on demons
- Don't dabble in anything occult related
- Focus on following Christ
- Our protection is in Christ and in the armor of Eph 6
 - We resist (James 4:7; 1 Peter 5:9)
 - Trust GOD'S power (1 Cor 10:13)
- Don't UNDER/OVER estimate Satan's power
- Romans 8:31
